



BUILDING crews are moving out of the Gold Coast's most prestigious new waterfront address, paving the way for owners to move in.

Construction company Boulderstone recently has achieved practical completion on Stockland's Allisee project at Hollywell two months ahead of schedule.

Boulderstone Queensland general manager Stephen Green said achieving early completion was satisfying.

"We worked together with Stockland to ensure the project could be delivered as efficiently as possible," he said.

Boulderstone's early completion of the luxurious Bijou and Maricel apartment buildings marks the final instalment of Allisee. The \$259 million project has been

constructed in four stages, creating a total of 85 apartments on The Broadwater-fronting site.

Mr Green said it was unusual for residential projects to be completed in portions.

"It worked really well in this case because it allowed us to step our way through the project, although in the later

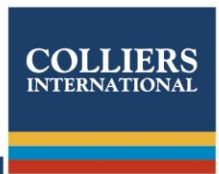
portions we had to be mindful of residents who had moved into the first of the buildings," he said.

The luxury development is made up of seven, six-storey apartment buildings, with outdoor terraces, two lap pools, barbecue facilities, function rooms and a media room.

Each apartment has been designed to maximise the open space and stunning views to create a haven of stylish, yet functional living with attention to detail and quality.

The buildings within the Allisee precinct are complemented by landscaped gardens, established Norfolk Pines and a 100-year-old fig.

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
